How to be a Veteran-Friendly Employer

Whether your company employs hundreds of military veterans, a few veterans or is just now starting to attract and hire veterans, celebrating Veterans Day is a unique opportunity to enhance your commitment to supporting those who wore our Nation's uniform.

Veterans Day is an official United States public holiday, observed annually on November 11, that honors military veterans, that is, persons who served in the United States Armed Forces. It coincides with other holidays, including Armistice Day and Remembrance Day, celebrated in other countries

that mark the anniversary of the end of World War I; major hostilities of World War I were formally ended at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918, when the Armistice with Germany went into effect. The United States previously observed Armistice Day. The U.S. holiday was renamed Veterans Day in 1954.

There are many ways to honor and celebrate the men and women in your company or organization who have served in the military on Veteran's Day. Some ideas include:

- Host a breakfast or lunch in their honor. Invite civilian colleagues to learn about the military experience, show their appreciation for the veteran employees' military service and build camaraderie among the teams. Whether formal or casual, a special lunch or reception honoring your veterans shows respect and appreciation. You may want to hang up a sign of thanks to veterans or ask someone to say a few words of thanks.
- Ask your CEO or a senior staff member to send an email thanking veterans in your workplace, and the vets who are family members of employees. Some of your employees may not even be aware that they are working next to a vet.
- If you have a company newsletter, share the story of veterans who work for and with you. This is an opportunity to show what military service is like, the challenges and accomplishments of your veteran employees, and the sacrifices made to ensure our Nation's liberties. It also reinforces the value veterans bring to the civilian workplace.
- Hold a pinning ceremony, giving out pins that represent their service and talking a little bit about their contributions to the workplace in relation to their military experience. It's a fun way to honor your vets while communicating positive core values to the rest of your team.
- Leave a "Salute Package" on the desks of



employees who are veterans. This could be a small gift, a handwritten note, or a formal certificate. Locally, we are excited to be working with 13 Stripes Supply Co. They offer several items that would be fantastic gifts for veterans, as well as items to display at your business. • Submit your events! Visitors are looking for things to do, and our calendar of events is their one-stop shop! Head to visitaberdeensd.com/submit.

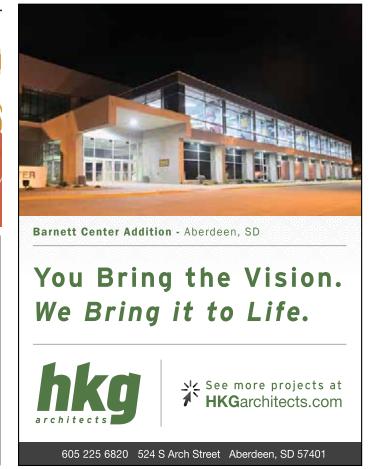

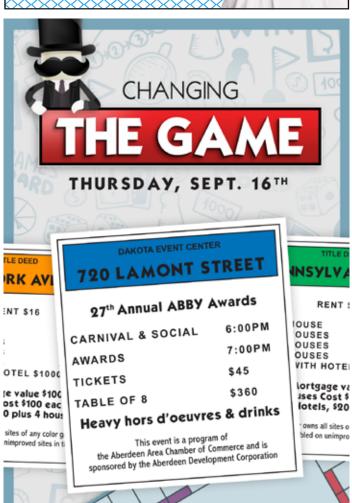

Fun Facts About the NSU Regional Sports Complex

When the Northern State University Regional Sports Complex opens this month, it won't just be the tallest building on campus – by all calculations, it'll also likely be the tallest in the region.

"We are not claiming to be the Guinness Book of World Record testing officials, but the NSU Regional Sports Complex stands 88 feet tall, which puts it 2 feet taller than the Brown County Federal Building, making it the tallest building (excluding agricultural bins/elevators) in northeastern South Dakota," explained Kody Schochenmaier, architectural associate with CO-OP Architecture.

CO-OP, of Aberdeen, designed the Sports Complex along with a team from DLR Group, Helms and Associates, Mettler Sichmeller Engineering and Confluence Landscape Architects.

Below is a list of other fun and interesting facts CO-OP shared about the Sports Complex!

Regional Sports Complex Fun Facts:

- There are 674 total Vibratory Stone Columns totaling over 15,000 total feet in depth of columns below the Barnett Center Addition and Dacotah Bank Stadium.
- There was over 30,000 cubic yards of engineered soils/fill that were brought onto the site. There was an additional 8,000 cubic yards of top soil that had to be hauled off site.
- There are over 130,000 square feet of custom designed field turf that was installed.
- There are over 1 million pounds of structural steel (525 tons) for the structural systems of the NSU Regional Sports Complex buildings.
- There was over 300 miles of electrical and data wires pulled throughout the NSU Regional Sports Complex buildings.
- The Daktronics Scoreboard in the south endzone is 50 feet tall x 80 feet wide, or over 4,000 square feet double the size of most standard ranch style homes.
- Design and Construction of the NSU Regional Sports Complex spanned over 4 years from start of design to end of construction.

- The NSU Regional Sports Complex project site covered an area of around 16 acres.
- There are over 50 televisions installed in the NSU Barnett Center Addition, and Dacotah Bank Stadium.
- There are 10 premium Suites, 6 exterior Party Decks, 5 different levels, 3 different concession stands, and 1 custom designed football field incorporated within the fences of Dacotah Bank Stadium.
- There are 120 individual football lockers that are each hooked up to a state-of-the-art ventilation system to exhaust the sweat and moisture from the lockers and equipment stored in them.
- Total length of construction 17 months
- Construction Team: McCownGordon/Quest Construction

Facts Specific to Koehler Hall of Fame Softball Field:

- One of the finest NCAA softball stadiums in the country.
- Field turf infield and outfield design, with a large NSU Wolfhead covering much of centerfield.
- Sunken dugouts where the players step up to an elevated field surface.
- 220 feet to dead centerfield. 200 feet down right and left field foul lines.
- Home and visitors bullpens attached to the dugouts.
- Home batting cage
- Daktronics scoreboard
- Home plate and centerfield TV camera filming technology.
- Chair back and bench seating available.

Saving Lives Through Personal Responsibility #CountingOnYou

One of the South Dakota Department of Transportation's strategic goals is to reduce the number of serious injuries and fatalities related to highway crashes. Safety in all we do is a core value that guides our daily actions. For the SDDOT, safety means a transportation system designed to protect our users by implementing life-saving measures and deploying innovative safety solutions like high friction surface treatment or centerline and shoulder rumble strips.

However, we all need to take personal responsibility to reduce injuries and fatalities happening daily on our state's roadways. We often hear that striving for zero fatalities is unrealistic or unattainable, yet any other goal should simply be unacceptable to all of us. When we understand that a traffic crash fatality could be a member of our own family, rather than an impersonal statistic, the significance becomes much clearer.

Working together, we can strive toward zero, the only acceptable number. Let's make this personal.

Below is "my family's story," which we have been sharing through SDDOT's #CountingOnYou safety awareness campaign.

My Family's Story:

I've worked for the Department of Transportation for over 35 years. I talk about the importance of safe driving every single day in my professional role. However, my own father, Don Jundt (pictured to the immediate right) was like many others who simply refused to wear his seat belt. No matter how we tried to promote seat belt safety, he didn't see the need to comply. That changed one day when my young niece, Meggan, told her grandpa that she wanted him to wear his seat belt because she loved him and was counting on him to come

home safely every night. Something about Meggan's plea made my dad reexamine his driving behavior. He has worn a seat belt ever since! That grandkid (Meggan – pictured below on the right) is all grown up now and has kids of her own. Thanks to Meggan, my dad is here to play with his great grandkids!

Take a moment to consider your own driving habits. Do you speed, text and drive, drive drowsy, or drive distracted?

Think about the "Meggan" in your life. Who is #CountingOnYou to arrive home safely?

Aberdeen Area Project Update:

The U.S. Highway 12 and U.S. Highway 281 project that began in May through the city of Aberdeen is progressing. Many concrete repairs and ADA Ramps are done. The intersection of Highway 12 and Roosevelt Street was completed at the end of July.

The \$5.6 million project includes concrete repair, surfacing, grading, curb and gutter, storm sewer, pavement markings, roadway lighting, signals, and permanent signing. Additional sidewalk is being added to increase pedestrian access to businesses on the east side of the city. Intersection updates will also be completed. The project is designed to improve traffic flow, public safety measures, and ADA compliance.

As the project progresses into the fall months, travelers will continue to notice lane adjustments on both Highways 12 and 281.

Health Insurance: What You Need to Know

Health insurance! Is it worth it? Do I really need it? I am healthy and never go to the doctor. These are some of the most common things we hear from current and potential customers at our office. And the answer is yes. You do need it, and it is worth it. This is true if you are healthy and rarely utilize any of the healthcare services available to you. After reading this article, I want everyone to know that there are options, and affordable options for health insurance.

Health insurance can be complicated, and it is also an industry that is always changing. But the truth is, it has never been easier to gain health coverage and for many, health insurance can be very inexpensive and often free.

So what does this mean to you and your overall physical and financial health? Honestly, it means a tremendous amount. Like most things in the world today, the cost of many office visits and medical procedures are very expensive. If people are left to pay for these things without insurance, it can be very burdensome.

I think it's important that people understand what some of the terms associated with their health insurance mean. There is no need to make this more complicated than it needs to be.

- What is a deductible?
- This is the amount of money paid out by the insured before the insurance company will pay any expenses.
- What is co-insurance?
- This is the percentage that is paid by the insured and the insurance company after the deductible is met. For example, if your plan has a co-insurance of 20% (often referred to as an 80/20 health plan) this means the insured would pay 20% of all charges and the insurance company would pay 80% of all charges after the deductible is met.
- What is an annual out-of-pocket maximum?
- This is the maximum amount of money an insured will be responsible to pay out of their own pocket for medical expenses during a calendar year. For example, if the annual out of pocket maximum on a health plan is \$8,000, after the insured incurs \$8,000 worth of charges, the insurance company will cover 100% of the remaining charges for the rest of that year.

Without a doubt, most of the confusion when it comes to health insurance has to do with these three terms.

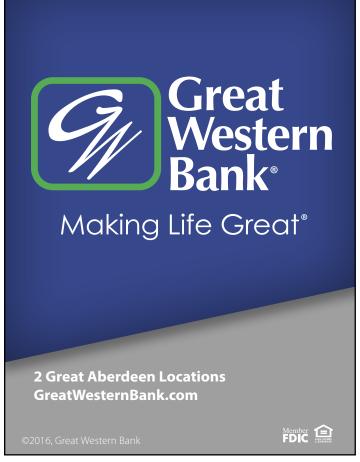

First Year Reflections and Looking Ahead at the Future

They say time flies when you are having fun, and that rings true in my case. In mid-June I reached the one-year milestone as your City Manager. Some may say that one year isn't really that big of deal. But when you look at it in the context of the city management profession, where the average tenure is five years (when I entered the profession the average was only three years), it does have relevance.

In my first article in this publication, I discussed my very positive first impressions of Aberdeen and the strong welcome I was receiving from the community. That positivity and pride in community continues today. I can't say it enough, the people here are amazing. The community has a strong foundation and plays a very important part in the state's economy. And while it is easy to say that Aberdeen is a great place to live, here are three key elements that I have noted that, in my humble opinion, are key to the community's viability. To be fair, there are many more positive attributes that could be mentioned, but for sake of time I offer these as my top three.

- Education-1 have said it before, but the educational opportunities that exist in Aberdeen, K-12 and higher education, are generally unheard of in a community of our size. Their quality is also top notch. Quality education is something that helps bring people to town and is critical in keeping them here.
- Value Based Agriculture-This is a buzzword that I have really embraced. It is easy to say that agriculture, both in crops and livestock, is a major economic driver in our region and has been for generations. But once the crops and livestock are grown and sold, where do they go? The answer is often out of state. Value based agriculture refers to using locally grown crops to make usable products before they leave the region. Here in

Aberdeen, Demkota Beef (cows) and AGP (soybeans) are two great examples. Both are doing well and that success will likely lead to continued expansion and growth in the future.

• Quality of Life Amenities- For me, this relates to what people do with their leisure time. Our Parks and Recreation Department does a great job in providing a multitude of recreational facilities and programs. We also have access to many state parks and recreational areas. And if that isn't enough, there are also many commercial recreation venues available. Wylie Park is a gem that is great for those that live here, but also draws many visitors each year.

While there are many positive attributes to our community, it can be a challenge to plan for and keep up with growth. I see two critical areas that top the list of areas of focus that will keep our community viable.

- Water and Wastewater Infrastructure- This is a top priority for the City and we are working on a variety of efforts in these areas that will be topics of discussion in the foreseeable future.
- Housing and Workforce- I listed these together as they seem to fit in the category of "which comes first, the chicken or the egg". I feel they are both equally important. It may sound cliché, but if you build it they will come.

As I conclude, I also want to stress that building community takes teamwork. We have many great partners in this community- both public and private- and history tells us that when we work together, great things happen. As the next year progresses I pledge to do my part to keep Aberdeen a great place to live, work, and play.

World Alzheimer's Month is an annual international event, always held in September and run by Alzheimer's Disease International, (ADI). The aim of the month is to raise awareness and challenge stigma surrounding Alzheimer's and dementia. The event has been running since 2012, and September 21st is World Alzheimer's Day.

Globally there is thought to be poor understanding and a great deal of stigma surrounding dementia, so the work of World Alzheimer's Month is vital and is growing and targeting the stigma and lack of understanding and knowledge surrounding Alzheimer's disease and dementia as well as supporting those suffering with the disease.

World Alzheimer's Month is an opportunity for sufferers, caregivers, professionals, and communities to work together against dementia, as well as raising awareness of the realities of it, while combating stigma and misinformation and lobbying the government for better help and care.

Dementia is a degenerative brain condition that affects over 50 million people internationally and which robs a person of their memory, competency, comprehension and behavioral awareness. There are over 100 forms of dementia, the most common being Alzheimer's Disease at 50-60% of all dementia cases.

Claim Disability Discrimination Results in \$125 Million Jury Verdict Against Walmart

An eight-member jury in Green Bay, Wisconsin recently returned a verdict of \$125,150,000 in favor of the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) on three claims of disability discrimination against Walmart. The jury found that the retailer failed to accommodate Marlo Spaeth, a longtime employee with Down syndrome, and then fired her in July 2015 because of her disability.

The EEOC presented evidence that Walmart changed the employee's schedule from Noon to 4 PM, rather than her prior schedule of 1 PM to 5:30 PM. The abrupt change presented a significant hardship for Ms. Spaeth, who has Down syndrome and thrives on routine. She repeatedly told a manager that she wanted her old schedule back, but her requests were dismissed. The schedule change caused her great anxiety because she feared missing the bus and missing dinner. She also reported feeling sick over the change, and started missing work or coming in late. Walmart refused to change her schedule back. On the date she was fired, a Walmart training coordinator took Ms. Spaeth's vest and walked her out of the store where she had worked for about 16 years.

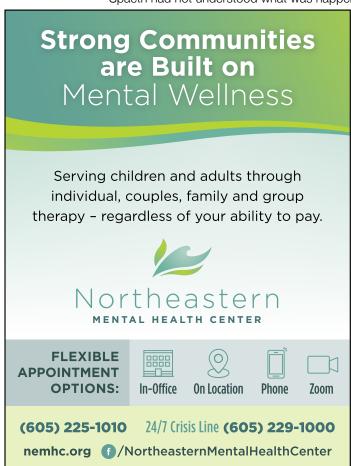
The training coordinator later testified that both she and Ms. Spaeth had been crying, and that Ms. Spaeth had not understood what was happening.

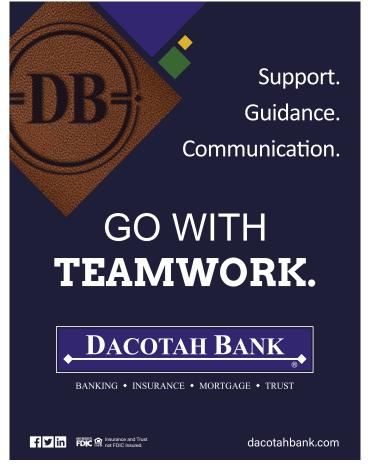
While Walmart's defense team maintains the verdict must get reduced in accordance with applicable law, it should send a message to all employers that a disabled employee's requests for



reasonable accommodations in the workplace must be considered. A failure to do so may be in violation of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), which prohibits discrimination based on an employee's disability. As stated in response to the verdict: "Employers, no matter how large, have an obligation under the law to evaluate the individual circumstances of employees with disabilities when considering requests for reasonable accommodations," said Chicago District Director Julianne Bowman. "Ms. Spaeth's request was a simple one and denying it profoundly altered her life."

Employee Retention Credit: \$7K Quarterly Wage Subsided Per Employee for 2021

The COVID recession isn't over for everyone. For businesses still struggling to return to 2019 revenue levels, the tax law has a lifeline: a refundable tax credit of up to \$7,000 per-employee, per-quarter.

The Employee Retention Credit (ERC) is a refundable tax credit available to eligible employers on qualified wages, including specific health care costs, paid from March 13, 2020 – December 31, 2021. Eligible employers are those with a significant decline in gross receipts or a full or partial suspension of the operation of their trade or business because of a government order due to COVID-19.

The enhanced Employee Retention Credit follows more favorable 2021 rules than were originally enacted for 2020. These rules include:

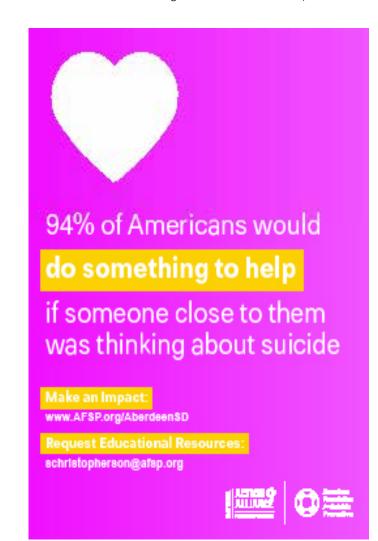
- Lowering the threshold for meeting the "eligible employer" standard under the gross receipts test (requiring only a 20% decline in gross receipts compared to a 50% decline required for the 2020 ERC)
- Raising the credit rate to 70% (from 50% in 2020)

- Raising the maximum qualified wages to \$10,000 per quarter (from \$10,000 aggregate for all of 2020)
- Raising the "small employer" limit to 500 full-time employees (compared to 100 full-time employees for the 2020 ERC)

As a result, the maximum ERC per employee for 2021 is now \$28,000, compared to \$5,000 for the 2020 version of the ERC. It's easy to see how \$7,000 per quarter, per employee, can add up. For a qualifying company with 20 employees, for example, it could mean as much as \$560,000 in benefits for 2021.

If eligible this tax credit is claimed on quarterly payroll tax returns. Because it is "refundable," the IRS will issue employers a check for any amount of the credit in excess of the quarterly payroll taxes.

The passport backlog has ballooned to an unprecedented level, with more than 2 million Americans expecting 12-to-18-week delays – nearly three times longer than the typical processing time of four to six weeks. My office is doing everything we can to help South Dakotans get their passports renewed in

time. We are talking with these agencies daily to help speed the process along, and I'm keeping pressure on the responsible agencies in Washington to get this corrected.

My office can help with far more than passports. Whatever roadblocks you're facing with federal government agencies, we can be a resource to help you navigate the federal bureaucracy and even act as a liaison on your behalf, if necessary.

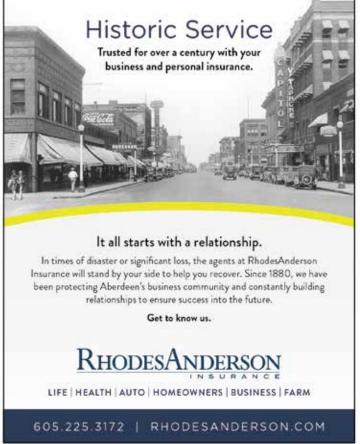

Forgiveness: You Must Ask in Order to Receive

The Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) was one of the largest and most popular COVID Relief programs offered by the Small Business Administration (SBA). Overall, the SBA and lenders have made over 11.7 million loans totaling nearly \$800 billion in relief to over 8.5 million small businesses. The forgiveness feature of this loan program attracted small businesses to apply for current relief without the worry of future obligations. However, the forgiveness is not a given; ALL businesses must apply for PPP forgiveness. While the various PPP funding rounds and forgiveness process have evolved over time, the requirement to apply for forgiveness has never changed. So, if you have a PPP loan and you have NOT applied for forgiveness, you are still obligated to repay. The good news is it's not too late to apply. Even if you have begun repayment, you can apply to have the remaining balance forgiven. As of July 30, forgiveness applications had been received for just over 5 million loans (less than 45% of loans made).

There are two ways to apply for forgiveness. The first and primary way is to do so through the lender where you received the loan. SBA has three forgiveness applications (depending on your loan specifics). Some banks are incorporating these into their electronic banking platforms while others are taking hard copy applications. Borrowers must follow instructions from their lender regarding how the lender expects the borrower to submit a forgiveness application for its PPP loan. Your originating lender can assist you through the process.

The second and most recent way is to apply directly through SBA's PPP Loan Forgiveness Portal that went live on August 4, 2021. This portal is a streamlined application portal specifically for borrowers with PPP loans \$150,000 or less through participating lenders. If your lender has not opted in or the portal rejects your application for any other reason, you must apply through your lender. The portal includes a User Guide, FAQ's, and a live customer service number. SBA is also offering borrower training webinars.

The SBA programs still available for COVID relief to businesses include Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL) and EIDL Advances (deadline 12/31/21), Shuttered Venue Operators Grant (deadline 8/20/21), and SBA Debt Relief program. As I have written about previously, these programs highlight again the importance of a good relationship with your business lender and your business bookkeeping/tax advisor. They are the professionals who can help you navigate these programs, determine how they apply to your business, and give you guidance on the information needed to utilize them.

Mental Health Matters



In a country where every year there are more than forty thousand suicides and sixty thousand drug overdose deaths, mental health matters.

Our nation has overlooked mental health for too long. Suicide is one of the leading causes of death for South

Dakotans, which is heartbreaking, unacceptable, and why we must do more.

The COVID-19 pandemic exposed and exacerbated the underinvestment in mental healthcare in our country. According to a study by the Centers for Disease Control, during the height of the pandemic, anxiety and depression symptoms were three to four times higher than the year prior.

Every time our nation faces a tragedy, debate starts over about the need to invest in mental health in order to prevent future tragedy – but action has yet to come at a federal level.

That's why in July, I introduced the Supporting Underserved Populations by Placing Our Resources in Trusts (SUPPORT) for Mental Health Act along with Representative Kim Schrier, M.D. Our bipartisan bill will allow states to utilize already appropriated unused COVID-19 relief funds to create trusts to support state-based mental and behavioral health services.

Recently, I visited the Link, a new community triage center in Sioux Falls. The Link offers free support services for people living with mental health and substance abuse challenges. I saw firsthand how crucial of an asset this center is to Sioux Falls and surrounding communities.

The trust established by the state through the SUPPORT for Mental Health Act would be able to provide financial support to the Link and similar facilities across South Dakota.

Additionally, these trusts could be used to help fund services such as suicide prevention, crisis counseling, inpatient and outpatient programs.

With an estimated \$1 trillion in COVID-19 relief still left unspent, this straightforward, common-sense approach will begin a serious investment in mental health resources for people across South Dakota and the United States.

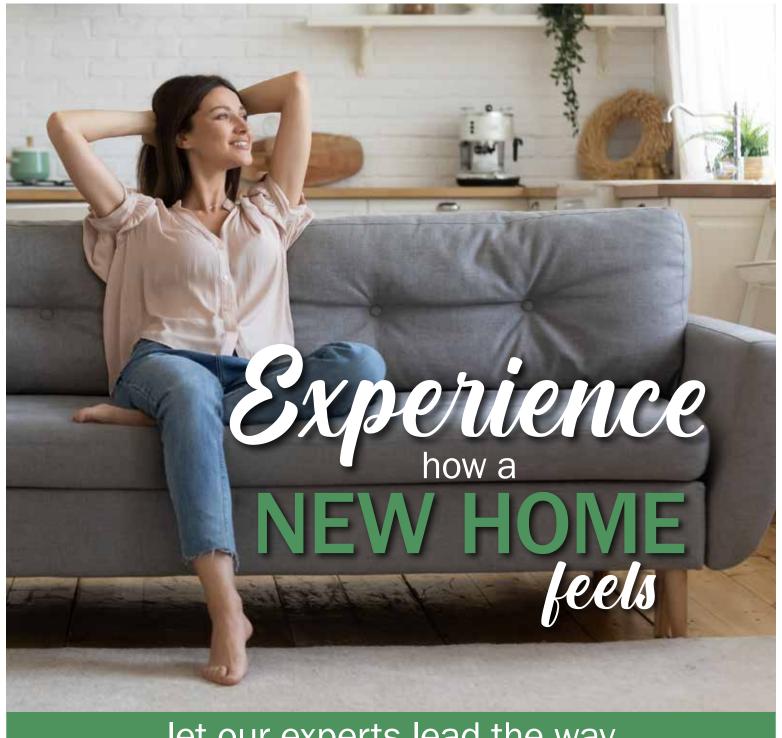
